1. General

This document is part of the British Competition Rules (the "BCR"), and lists the Regulations governing the organising and running of particular British competitions on snow. Refer to BCR Book I for overall details about BCR and its application.

1.1. Perpetual Trophies / Challenge Cups

The lists of Challenge Cups or perpetual trophies included in the event regulations are under review and will be updated in due course.

2. British Alpine Ski Championships

2.1. Eligibility

- 2.1.1. All British competitors must be registered with their respective registration authority. British eligibility rules apply.
- 2.1.2. British Championships (Non British Team): winners must not have been selected to be a member of the British Senior or Junior Teams for the current or previous season.
- 2.1.3. British Championships (Under 18): Winners must be under 18 on 1st January of the current year.
- 2.1.4. The Championships may be international.

2.2. Acceptance

- 2.2.1. The Championships are open to Senior and Junior competitors only.
- 2.2.2. Acceptance for British entries will be decided on the basis of BASS Seed Points. On the recommendation of the TD Forum, the Organising Committee may set a minimum standard, which should be published in the Announcement.
- 2.2.3. The acceptances decided in the United Kingdom will establish the minimum standard to be applied in the resort.

2.3. Competence

- 2.3.1. Competitors are reminded that the Jury has the right and the duty (ICR 601.4.6.3) to exclude competitors who do not measure up to the difficulties of the course.

- 2.4.4. Combined Trophies
- Combined Trophies are available for presentation in accordance with Section 5. Only races held at the same location and in the same period are eligible to be considered for combined awards. The decision to award Combined Trophies is to be made by the Chief of Championships in agreement with the sponsor(s) (if any) and BSS.

3. British Junior Alpine Ski Championships

3.1. Eligibility.

- 3.1.1. All British competitors must be registered with their respective registration authority.
- 3.1.2. British Eligibility Rules apply.
- 3.1.3. The championships may be international.
- 3.1.4. The Championships are open to Junior competitors in the U18 and U21 age groups, but the Organising Committee may invite up to 6 British Seniors to compete in each event. Seniors are not eligible to win prizes, but their results will be taken into consideration for the penalty calculation (See Rules of the FIS Points 1.4).

Exception: When the Downhill is run as a part of the British Senior Championships, the Organising Committee may allow all Senior entrants to participate.

3.2. Acceptance

- 3.2.1. Acceptance for British entries will be decided on the basis of BASS Points. On the recommendation of the TD Forum, the Organising Committee may set a minimum standard, which should be published in the Announcement.
- 3.2.2. The acceptances decided in the United Kingdom will establish the minimum standard to be applied in the resort.
- 3.2.3. Final selection will be decided by the Organising Committee prior to the first Team Captain's meeting.

3.3. Competence

- 3.3.1. Competitors must be competent racers. They are reminded that the Jury has the right and the duty (ICR 601.4.6.3) to exclude competitors who do not measure up to the difficulties of the course.

3.4. Inter Club Trophy

- 3.4.1. No separate team events will be run. Competitors shall compete for their first named club, as shown on the current BASS list. (For Snowsport England registered racers, this is their declared snow club). Except in the most exceptional circumstances and with the prior approval of the Organising Committee, no changes shall be allowed in the resort.
- 3.4.2. Combined Race Points or Championship Points shall be calculated for each competitor in accordance with BCR Book III. For each Club, the Combined Points for the three best boys and two best girls competing for that Club shall be totalled.
- 3.4.3. The Inter Club Trophy for the Best Junior Club shall be presented to the Club with the best total Combined Points, as calculated in rule 3.4.2 above. For two discipline competitions, this shall be the lowest total Combined Race Points. For three or more disciplines, this shall be the highest total British Championship Points.

3.5. Prizes

- 3.5.1. Tokens are awarded to the first, second and third boy and girl in each discipline in each age group. U18 may compete for and win Overall Junior trophies.

4. British Children's Alpine Ski Championships

4.1. Eligibility

- 4.1.1. British Eligibility Rules apply.
- 4.1.2. All competitors must be registered with their respective registration authority.
- 4.1.3. The Championships are open to U14 and U16 competitors only.

4.2. Acceptance

- 4.2.1. Acceptance will be decided on the basis of BASS Seed Points. On the recommendation of the TD Forum, the Organising Committee may set a minimum standard, which should be published in the announcement.
- 4.2.2. The acceptances decided in the United Kingdom will establish the minimum standard to be applied in the resort.
- 4.2.3. Final selection will be decided by the Organising Committee prior to the first Team Captains' meeting

4.3. Competence

- 4.3.1. Competitors must be competent racers.

4.4. Start Order

- 4.4.1. Start Order shall be in accordance with BCR Book I 608.6.

4.5. U10 and U12 Competitions

- 4.5.1. Competitions for U10 and U12 may be held in association with this event, but will not be considered as a Championship.

4.6. Team Competitions

- 4.6.1. No separate team events will be run. Competitors shall compete for their first named club, as shown on the current BASS list. (For Snowsport England registered racers, this is their declared snow club). Except in the most exceptional circumstances and with the prior approval of the Organising Committee, no changes shall be allowed in the resort.
- 4.6.2. Best Named Club Teams
- 4.6.3. There shall be four categories: U14 Boys, U14 Girls, U16 Boys and U16 Girls. U14 competitors shall not be allowed to compete in U16 teams.
- 4.6.4. Girls' teams shall consist of no more than 3 competitors, of whom 2 are to count.
- 4.6.5. Boys' teams shall consist of no more than 4 competitors, of whom 3 are to count.
- 4.6.6. From each of the Slalom, Giant Slalom and Super-G results, the Race Points of the 2 best girls, or 3 best boys, in each team shall be totalled. If a team has less than 2 girls, or 3 boys, finishing in each of the three disciplines, the team shall not qualify. Each race is calculated separately, and the competitors to count in each race may be different.
- 4.6.7. In each category, the best team shall be the team with the lowest number of Race Points as calculated in 4.6.6 above.
- 4.6.8. Teams must be named by the end of the first Team Managers' meeting.

4.7. Best Club

- 4.7.1. There shall be two categories: Best U14 Club, Best U16 Club
- 4.7.2. British Championship Points shall be calculated from the Slalom, Giant Slalom and Super-G results for each competitor in accordance with Section 5. For each Club, the British Championship Points for the three best boys and two best girls competing for that Club shall be totalled.
- 4.7.3. The Best Club Trophies shall be presented to the U14 Club and the U16 Club with the most British Championship Points, as calculated in rule 4.7.2 above.

4.8. Prizes

- 4.8.1. Tokens are awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd boy and girl in each discipline and combined in each age group.

4.10. Combined Trophies

- 4.10.1. Combined Trophies are available for presentation in accordance with Section 5. Only races held at the same location and in the same period are eligible to be considered for combined awards. The decision to award Combined Trophies is to be made by the Chief of Championships in agreement with the sponsor(s) (if any) and BSS.

5. British Championship Combined Competitions

5.1. Alpine Combined

A combined competition tests a competitor's ability over two, and sometimes more, disciplines. The British Championship Combined Competition comprises all of, or a selection from, the following disciplines: DH, SG, SC, GS and SL.

- 5.1.1. The different races to be combined must be decided by the organisers and announced in the programme.
- 5.1.2. The combined results in a two discipline championship shall be calculated by adding the competitor's race points in each discipline of the championship. Only those competitors who successfully complete both disciplines shall have a combined result.
- 5.1.3. The combined results in a championship comprising three or more disciplines shall be calculated by summing the British Championship Points awarded to the top 30 finishers for each event. It is not necessary for a competitor to compete in or finish every discipline.
- 5.1.4. British Championship Points are awarded according to the following schedule:

- 5.1.5. If, in a race, several competitors are tied for one of the first thirty positions, each tied competitor receives the points corresponding to that position. The remaining competitors receive the points corresponding to their official classification in the race. Thus, if two competitors tie for third place, the points awarded are: 1st 100, 2nd 80, 3rd= 60, 3rd= 60, 5th 45, 6th 40 etc.

6. Calendar

6.1. Publication

- 6.1.1. The British Calendar will be published by BSS twice a year in October and April.
- 6.1.2. The Calendar is to be compiled by the BSS Office under the guidance of the TD Forum.

6.2. Contents

- 6.2.1. The following events are to be included in the Calendar:
 - International events organised by BSS, CGs or Clubs – (FIS).
 - British non-FIS events - (GBR).
 - Constituent Group non-FIS events - (CG).
 - Club events - (C).
- 6.2.2. Other major skiing events may be listed if space is available.
- 6.2.3. The following information is to be given for each event:
Date; Site; Country; Name of Event; Organiser; Category; Disciplines; Men/Ladies.
- 6.2.4. Race Organisers are to pass this information to BSS via the relevant CG by the dates stipulated on the Calendar Application Form, available at www.gbski.com.
- 6.2.5. Events which are intended to count for seed points are to be indicated by *.
- 6.2.6. The closing dates and publication dates of the BASS seed lists are to be included.
- 6.2.7. The name, telephone number and e-mail address of the Race Organiser/Secretary, to whom entries must be sent and from whom information can be obtained, must be included for all races on the Calendar.
- 6.2.8. Either with the calendar application or as soon as possible thereafter, the Race Organiser should send a schedule of races for each day to BSS and the relevant Constituent Group so that the information can be included in the British (and FIS, if appropriate) Calendar.
- 6.2.9. All applications for British FIS events must be made through BSS office and be approved by the TD Forum before the application is passed to FIS.

6.3. Calendar Fees

- 6.3.1. For non-FIS events, a per race/training day Calendar Fee is payable to BSS at the time of application, at the rate specified on the Application Form.
- 6.3.2. For FIS events, consult BSS office for the current FIS calendar fees payable at the time of application.
