



English Alpine Ski Championships

Prize Schedule and Competition Rules

Prizes/awards for most races (including all FIS races) take place at the finish (or other designated location) after each race, as soon as the TD is happy for this to happen and the results have been collated. Awards for all races are listed below; the same awards are made for Male and Female.

FIS NJR Individual Races

In each race, prizes are awarded for 1st 2nd 3rd place in U18 and U21 age groups, Ladies and Men, all nations, no overall prizes.

FIS Individual Races

In each race, prizes are awarded for 1st 2nd 3rd overall, not by age group, all nations.

In each race, prizes are also awarded for 1st 2nd 3rd in U18, U21 and Senior age groups, GBR racers only (no international).

In each age group in each race, the first-placed English-registered GBR racer (SSE registration) is designated 'English Champion' for that discipline and age group.

U14 and U16 Individual Races

In each race, prizes are awarded for 1st 2nd 3rd in each age group, any HNGB. For SL and GS these prizes are based on combined times from 2 runs.

In each age group in each race, the first-placed English-registered racer (SSE registration) is designated 'English Champion' for that discipline and age group.

U10 and U12 Individual Races

In each race, prizes are awarded for 1st 2nd 3rd 4th 5th in each age group, and for first overall boy and girl. There is no designated 'Champion' in this age group.

English Overall Combined Competitions

There are three combined competitions, one incorporating all age groups competing across the three FIS (not NJR) races, and the other two across the three U14 and the three U16 races, for English-registered GBR racers (SSE registration) only, to determine the overall combined champions. Points are awarded for positions in each race as per the rules below.

Club Competition

As per the rules shown below, points are awarded for positions in age group across the three disciplines for both Children and FIS. Two awards are made, the 'Dave Ryding Club Championship' for the winning club, and the 'Ambition Academy Challenge' for the winning academy.

Individual Combined Competitions

The English Alpine Championship combined competitions test a competitor's ability over two or more disciplines. The rules for these competitions are the same as those used at the British Alpine Championships (as listed in BCR IV section 5).

Combined results from two or three disciplines

The combined competition normally takes place over all three disciplines (Slalom, Giant Slalom and Super-G). In that case, the combined results shall be calculated by summing the Championship Points awarded to the top 30 English-registered finishers for each event. It is not necessary for a competitor to compete in or finish every discipline.

If one of the three disciplines does not take place, the combined results shall be calculated by adding the competitor's Race Points (not Championship Points) in each of the two remaining disciplines. Only those competitors who successfully complete both disciplines shall have a combined result.

If more than one race takes place in a particular discipline, the Organising Committee may designate beforehand that only one of those races will count for points in the Combined Competition.

Eligibility and events

The Combined Competition is only open to those registered with Snowsport England as per the BASS Seed List in effect at the time of the event. There are two Combined competitions, one taking results from the three Children's events and the other for Junior/Senior/Masters competitors in the three main FIS (not NJR) events.

Points awarded

Championship Points are awarded according to the following schedule:

Tied positions

If, in a race, several competitors are tied for one of the first thirty positions, each tied competitor receives the points corresponding to that position. The remaining competitors receive the points corresponding to their official classification in the race. Thus, if two competitors tie for third place, the points awarded are: 1st 100, 2nd 80, 3rd= 60, 3rd= 60, 5th 45, 6th 40 etc.

Club Combined Competition

The English Alpine Championship club competition is open to all registered racers from U14 upwards, with Senior and Masters combined into a single group.

Points are awarded to the first five BASS-registered competitors in each age group, gender and discipline. Points are thus awarded to U14 and U16 in the Children's races, and U18, U21 and Senior categories in the FIS (not NJR) races.

Points are allocated to those competitors first named club as specified on the BASS list that applies at the time of the event. No substitution, replacement or exchange of first and second named club will be allowed.

Where a competitor is placed in the first five and has no first-named club, no points will awarded for that place.
