Course Setters and Referees



To help us strengthen the links between the race organisation and the coaching community, we are offering the chance for an experienced coach to take the lead in organising the course setters and referees for all the races. Our Championships is an ideal development opportunity for coaches to gain experience in both course setting and refereeing, and we are looking for someone knowledgeable about other coaches' abilities and needs to help coordinate the 'matrix' of volunteers. There are over 30 courses to be set and over 15 referee positions, plus the option to 'shadow' roles, so there is plenty of work to be done!

The successful candidate would be working within the following guidelines:

- Scope includes course setters, referees, assistant referees, and shadows
- Children's races: up to 100% GBR setters and referees
- FIS races: up to 75% GBR setters and referees
- Fair and equitable spread across all clubs/teams/nations
- Final say on all assignments rests with ROC and Juries
- ROC to be updated with progress at regular intervals
- Final list to be constructed no later than two weeks before competition
- Process to run this time as a trial to see how it goes
- Process to be reviewed post-competition to evaluate success

The deadline for applications is Friday December 1st and the successful applicant will be notified by email the same day.
